Bespoke bits made to order

Bitless and combination bridles

orseman have long been seeking a system that would provide the benefits of the hackamore and a bit in one easy to use item. That is why Edward Holt Industries has been working alongside the eminent trainer Richard Maxwell to develop various forms of combination bridles, with a mix of hackamores and mouthpieces, to suit differing applications.

The bosal, Spanish hackamore, side pull and mechanical hackamore – all bitless bridles – differ in that the first three use non-amplified pressure on the nose, whereas the mechanical hackamore, as the name implies, with its cheek pieces and curb strap, is able to mechanically amplify nose band pressure.

The bosal and Spanish hackamore also differ from the others by having their reins attached centrally behind the head, and require a different riding technique.

These bitless bridles are often used as a training aid for movement before a bit is placed in the horse's

mouth and help ensure a soft-mouthed horse.

A combination bridle then attaches some form of bit as well, sometimes using two sets of reins, sometimes one.

The earliest form we know of is the side-pull half breed, which while using a snaffle bit, also has a rope nose band attached to the snaffle rings, and therefore uses one set of reins. With this form of set-up, the pressure applied relies on the rider's physical strength.

A mix of mechanical hackamore and some form of gag bit, while effective, requires not only correct fitting but also sensitive hands, making it necessary to school the rider as much as the horse.

But always remember that nothing can replace the good schooling of a horse.

The horse can feel the lightest of signals and the slightest shift in body weight. Guide from the head, but control from the seat with your body. The best you can ever hope for is co-operation.
